# Guillot, Peterson Elected to College of Fellows

NCARB Past President Frank M. Guillot (2005) and former Region 5 Director Stan Peterson are among 82 members of the American Institute of Architects recently elevated to the AIA's College of Fellows.

Honored for their significant contributions to the profession, these 82 individuals will receive their fellowship medals at the Investiture of Fellows Ceremony during the AIA 2006 National Convention and Design Expo in Los Angeles in early June.

Past President Guillot, a former member and officer of the Vermont State Board of Arch-

itects, is a principal with the Burlington-based firm, Guillot-Vivian-Viehmman Architects, Inc. Peterson, an architect based in Topeka, served as NCARB's Region 5 Director from 2002-2005. He also was a member and officer of the Kansas State Board of Technical Professions for 12 years.

Roberta D. Washington, a former member of the New York State Board of Architecture and volunteer committee member for ARE-related matters, also was among those chosen for AIA fellowship. **DC**

## Notable Retirements

### COUNCIL CFO RETIRES AFTER TWO DECADES OF SERVICE

**Dennis J. Flynn**, NCARB's chief financial officer for more than 20 years, recently retired in April 2006. Under his leadership and supervision, the Council experienced significant growth in its computerized methodologies for financial and accounting transactions, human resources, and record services. In recognition of his myriad contributions to the Council, Flynn received the NCARB President's Medal for Distinguished Service in 1999.

Among his accomplishments, Flynn directed NCARB's transition from paper-based files to a computer-based processing system. He established the information Systems Steering Group (ISSG), which has guided ongoing enhancements to NCARB's Customer Information System.

Additionally, Flynn implemented a number of human resources-related tools, including the first NCARB Staff Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual and a Personnel Performance Evaluation program. He also is

responsible for the Council's off-site records storage and records retention programs and user-friendly financial management reports.

Prior to joining NCARB, Flynn retired from the U.S. Army at the rank of Colonel, having served for more than 26 distinguished years in several command and staff positions, including assignments in Italy, Germany, Korea, and Vietnam.

NCARB membership and staff will officially bid farewell to Dennis Flynn and his wife Dee at the June 2006 Annual Meeting and Conference in Cincinnati.

### REGION 4 EXECUTIVE ADMINISTRATOR TO STEP DOWN IN JUNE

**Charlotte Wilcox**, the executive administrator for NCARB's Mid-Central Conference (Region 4), will retire at the end of June 2006. Wilcox has been affiliated with NCARB since April 1976.
