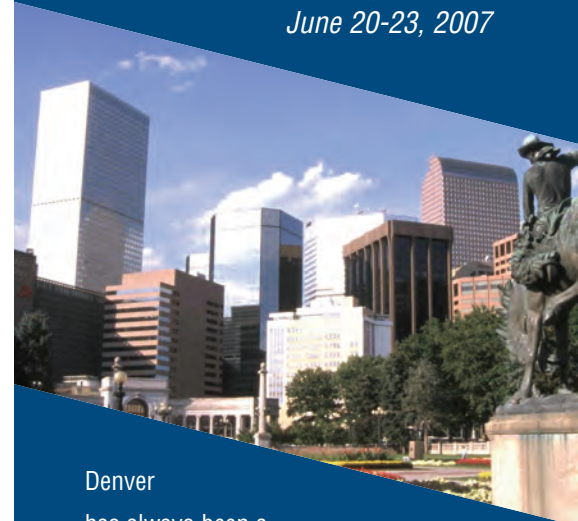
retired from the Council in April 2006. **Michiel M. Bourdrez, AIA**, director, education and international services, was recognized for 15 years with NCARB.
