

## Member Board Roundup

Pursuant to Act 002, Session Laws Hawaii 2005, the **Hawaii Board of Professional Engineers, Architects, Surveyors, and Landscape Architects** will require continuing education to renew an architect's license effective April 30, 2008, and every biennial renewal period thereafter. Architects will be required to complete 16 hours of CE credit hours during the biennium from May 1, 2006 to April 30, 2008. All CE courses shall be relevant to public protection subjects. Details of the CE requirements can be found in section 464-9(d), Hawaii Revised Statutes, and also will be specified in Chapter 16-115, Hawaii Administrative Rules, when adopted.

New Idaho Governor C. L. "Butch" Otter was sworn in January 1, 2007. With this change in leadership, there also has been a change in leadership for the **Idaho Bureau of Occupational Licenses**. The Bureau welcomed Tana Cory as its new bureau chief on January 2. Cory replaces Rayola Jacobsen.

The **Louisiana Board of Architectural Examiners** honored architects who passed their licensing exam at a banquet on January 19. The Board of Directors of the AIA LA were invited to share in the celebration. Robert Ivy,

Editor in Chief of nationally renowned *Architectural Record* magazine, addressed the group on the changing role of architects in the 21st century. The Licensing Board also gave each new licensee a certificate signed by the governor congratulating them on becoming licensed and an acrylic blue paper weight in the shape of Louisiana showing their name, architect, and date of initial registration.

The **Nebraska Board of Engineers and Architects** has moved its offices to 215 Centennial Mall South, Suite 400 in Lincoln. The board's mailing address (P.O. Box), phone numbers, e-mail address, and web site all remain the same.

Raymond J. Hengel completed his final term on the **South Dakota Board of Technical Professions** in 2006. For 16 years, he served the board with distinction, often providing a historical perspective for board matters. Hengel received a plaque in recognition of his long and faithful service.

Jeffrey A. Hazard has been appointed to fill Hengel's position on the South Dakota Board. Hazard is chief executive officer/

senior principal for Koch Hazard Architects, which is located in Sioux Falls. He previously worked for Kaplan McLaughlin Diaz in San Francisco for nine years before returning to South Dakota in 1988.

Hazard holds degrees from the University of Kansas, University College, London, and the University of Illinois, from which he earned an MBA in 1979 and an M.Arch in 1980. He has been licensed as an architect in South Dakota since 1982. Hazard is a member of the American Institute of Architects and previously served as president of AIA South Dakota. He also is a past chair of the Sioux Falls Community Development Advisory Committee; a past president of Main Street in Sioux Falls; a past chair for the Sioux Falls Board of Preservation; a past chair for the Siouxland Museum Board; and a member of the South Dakota Symphony Board.
