The NCARB Scholars program is limited to 16 participants each year to encourage in-depth conversations and ensure a high-quality experience. Expenses related to travel within the United States*, hotel accommodations, meals and participation will be covered by NCARB.

Eligibility

To apply to attend, applicants must:

1. Be a professor or adjunct faculty in an architecture program.
2. Teach, or be scheduled to begin teaching, a professional practice course. *Note: Faculty who desire to move into teaching professional practice may also apply, and should clearly state their intention in the application.*
3. Be able to attend the training event from August 7-9, 2025, in Salt Lake City, Utah.
4. Previous NCARB Scholars attendees are not eligible to attend this year's program

Application

To complete the application, you will need to include:

1. A brief statement of interest (200-500 words) explaining why you would like to attend the training program.
2. A brief description of your academic and /or professional work (max. 500 words).
3. Your current CV or resume. A brief CV (+/- 5 pages) is acceptable.
4. The name, email address, and phone number of one academic peer or department leader who will support your application. Upon receipt of your application, NCARB will contact that person to request a brief statement of support.

Selection process

The selection process is not based exclusively on merit or need. Each year, a volunteer advisory panel reviews applications and selects a mix of attendees, balancing a variety of experience levels and professional expertise. The panel aims to select a diverse group of participants to increase opportunities to exchange new ideas and well-tested approaches.

Location

This year, NCARB Scholars in Professional Practice will be hosted by the University of Utah's College of Architecture and Planning in Salt Lake City, the vibrant heart of the Mountain West. The University of Utah's nationally prominent architecture program, a cornerstone of architectural education in the region since 1949, offers a unique setting for this professional development event. Explore the evolving architectural landscape of a city poised at the intersection of its rich past and dynamic future.

** Note: Flights must be purchased at least 21 days in advance. Attendees may use NCARB's travel agent to avoid out-of-pocket expenses or will be reimbursed for approved flight costs after the event.*
