PUBLIC PERCEPTION OF LICENSURE

In 2019, NCARB partnered with Benenson Strategy Group to conduct a survey exploring the public perception of licensure and regulation. Nearly 1,000 responses were received from U.S. citizens who are registered to vote. The majority of voters feel that professional licensure for architects is an important factor in protecting the public health, safety, and welfare.
